Turn right at first light, which is Drake Rd.

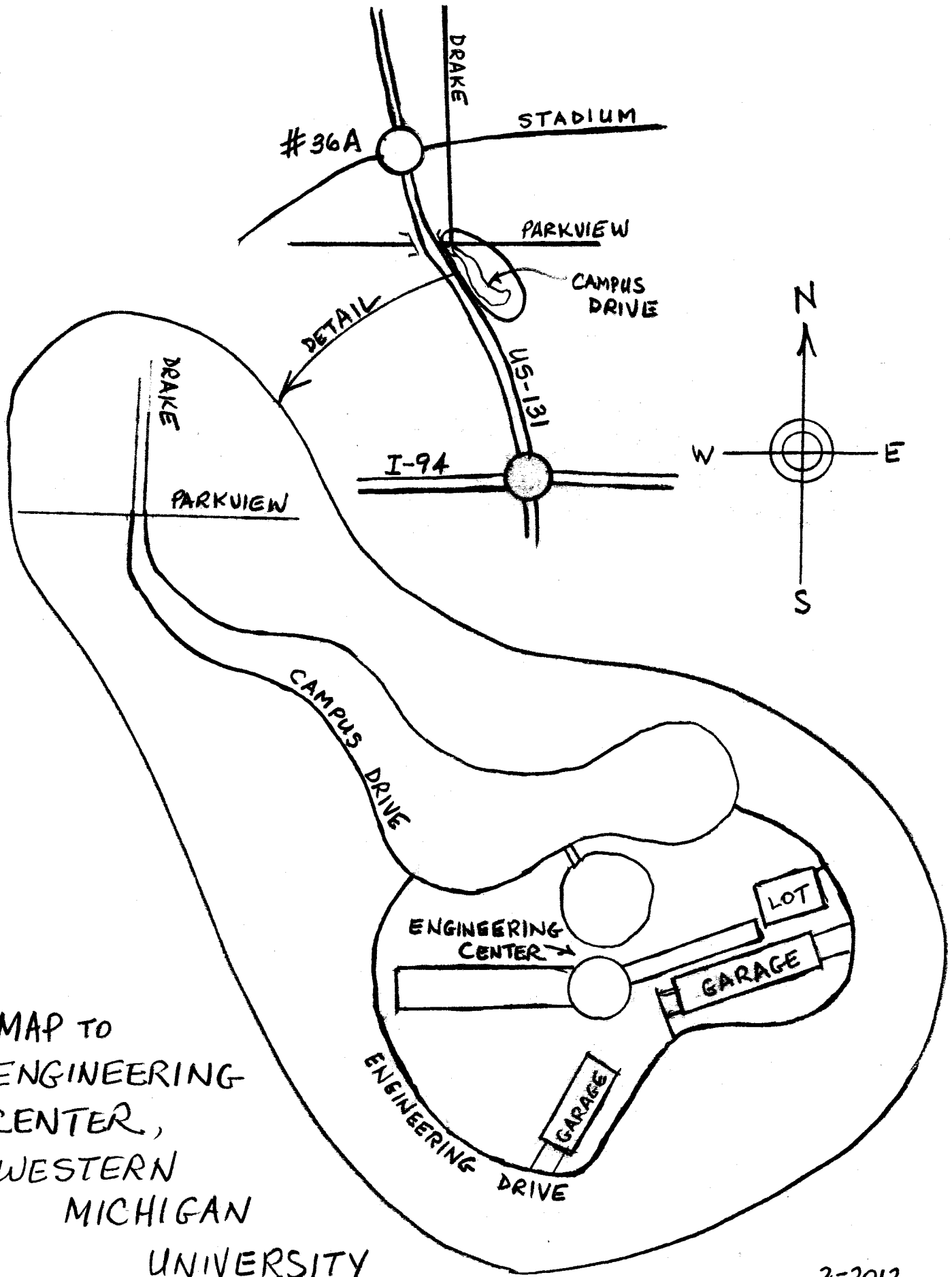
Continue on Drake Rd. through the next light (at Parkview Ave.) into the WMU Parkview Campus. You will now be on campus Drive.
